The past KOWIN DC president, Kwang Ja Kim, received the presidential award for her outstanding service to Korea on behalf of comfort women. ## The 2012 Yeosu KOWIN International Convention

August 28-31, 2012

This summer, from August 28 to 31, the annual KOWIN International Convention was held in Yeosu, Korea. Approximately 200 Korean women leaders (both from Korea and overseas) participated. Seven of the DC Chapter members attended this convention: Dr. Lucy Nam, Dr. Suzanne Kim Doud Galli, Sue-Kyong Shin Vittas, Helen Won, Stella Yi, Judi Rhee Alloway, and Susie Won. Under the theme "Korean Women Challenging Global Climate Change", a number of speeches were made by distinguished people, including Yeon Suk Lee, the former second Political Affairs Secretary and Hee Ja Lee, CEO of LOOPEN, and there were also many informative and intellectually stimulating group discussions. Several other noteworthy activities took place during the convention, such as the book donation program, in which participants donated about 1200 children books in their local languages, and an outing to the Steel-making factory and the EXPO Aguarium of Yeosu. The convention concluded with a tea time at Cheongwadae (the Blue House) with First Lady Kim Yoon-ok. The following paragraphs are reflections from several of our members who attended this event.

At a time when the number of Koreans living overseas has reached 7 million, and with the aim to increase the recognition of Korea by the world community, 90 Korean female leaders from 21 different countries gathered in Bucharest, the capital of Romania, for the 3<sup>rd</sup> International KOWINNER Convention from June 15<sup>th</sup> to 17<sup>th</sup> 2012. The attendees from our chapter included Dr. Myong Ho (Lucy) Nam, Hong Ja Kim, Sue-Kyong Shin Vittas, Sami Lauri, and Susan Oh. The Korean congressman, In Choon Son, attended this event. Han Taek Kim, the Korean ambassador to Romania, gave the opening speech.

This convention was held in Europe for the first time. In the past, the convention was hosted in Sydney and Hong Kong. This time, there was an emphasis on the arts and culture. KOWINNER awarded prizes to 21 people for the advancement of art and culture by Korean women in the international community. Hong Ja Kim from our DC chapter was presented the "Worldwide Recognition of Women's Art and Culture" award.

### **MEMBER NEWS**

Christine Choi Awarded By *Dongponews* as "2011 Person of the Year" for Her Contribution to Comfort Women Issues

Kwang-Ja Kim (Christine Choi), president of the Washington Coalition for Comfort Women Issues, Inc (WCCW) was named by the *Dongponews* newspaper publisher in Korea as the "2011 Person of the Year" in February, 2012, for her dedication and contribution to Comfort Women issues.



On December 1, 2012, the WCCW will hold its 20<sup>th</sup> annual conference at George Mason University. The conference will

include a symposium to showcase educational resources, publications, as well as a special exhibition of unique artwork created by globally prominent artists to illustrate and honor the lives of Comfort Women.

The WCCW cordially invite all KOWIN members to join this landmark event to support the resolution of unsolved and unresolved crimes committed against Comfort Women, and attempt to bring justice to all those whose lives were destroyed by the heinous actions of both the Japanese government and military. A formal invitation for this event will be delivered in the upcoming months. We encourage everyone's participation at the WCCW Conference on December 1, 2012.

Young-Key Kim-Renaud Participated in a Panel in the Third GW Global Forum and Delivered Lectures at Foreign Universities and Other Global Conference



In March 2012, Young-Key Kim-Renaud, Professor of Korean Language and Culture and International Affairs at the George Washington University (GW) and Chair of the East Asian Languages and Literatures Department, went to Seoul to attend the Third GW Global Forum, which met under the title "Global Growth and Innovation," in Seoul, Korea, March 16-17. Her panel was titled "The Information Revolution and the Ways People Interact, Think, Behave, and Access Public Health." While in Seoul, she was invited to deliver two special lectures at Sogang University on March 14, 2012: (1) "Education of English-speaking Students of Korean: Pragmatic Embedding for Linguistic Politeness"; (2) "Making Sense of Korean Sound Symbolism to English Speakers."

In July 2012, Kim-Renaud returned to Asia, this time to China. It was to attend the 18th International Conference of Korean Linguistics and the Xuzhou Conference on Linguistic Sciences, hosted by Jiangu Normal University School of Linguistic Sciences, Xuzhou, China, July 5-8. Her paper was titled "A Syntactic and Pragmatic Analysis of Subject Honorification." While in China she went to two other universities to deliver three special lectures: (1) "Quest for Identity: Korean Language and Culture in Changing Contexts," Shanghai University, July 4; (2) "Korean linguistic and cultural





identity in a global era," Yanbian University in Yanji, July 10; and (3) "Linguistic and Cultural Negotiation in Translating Modern Korean Fiction into English: A Case Study," Graduate School, Yanbian University, July 11. In Yanbian, Kim-Renaud also collected language data in order to compare their Korean with the Korean language variety spoken in South Korea.

## Mok Ja Sohn Appointed as the Second Chairperson of the Global Children Foundation



The Global Children Foundation (GCF) appointed Mrs. Mok Ja Sohn as its Chairperson, who plans to engage in more activities than ever in the future. The foundation was established by concerned mothers in Washington D.C. to help over 120,000 hungry Korean children as the economic crisis in Korea deepened in 1998. GCF, composed entirely of women, was able to create a sound member-supported financial database, and used its membership fees to help children.

Since its inception, GCF has been helping many needy children in over 30 countries including the United States, spending more than \$2.5 million. It has 20 branches and 4,000 members in the U.S., Hong Kong, Canada, Japan, and Korea. GCF supports after-school children programs, holds a bazaar in Seoul every autumn, and the general assembly meets annually in a selected region. All events are funded by the members. Last year's bazaar was held on September 15-16 at Ryu Kwan-sun Hall, Ewha Girls' High School in Seoul, Korea. The 2012 general assembly was held in Hong Kong from September 21 to 23, and the 15th anniversary general assembly will be held from July 12 to 14, 2013 in Hilton Tysons Corner, Virginia near Washington D.C.

## Jae-Ok Chang, author of 'Vignette of Korean Cooking, Received 'Woman of the Year' Award

Jae-Ok Chang received a 'Woman of the Year' award from Soon-Ja Kim, director of Global Korean Women Entrepreneurs Association on June 29<sup>th</sup> at Woo Lae Oak. (Young- Sook Park; Chair of the Washington Chapter).



Ms. Jang introduced her book and Korean cooking to the mainstream public at "2012 North America and Asian Women Leader Economic Forum"

Ms. Jang immigrated to the United States in the 1970s and she wanted to teach Korean cooking to her daughter. Eventually she published 4 Korean cook books written in both Korean and English. Originally living in Ohio, she moved to Washington DC in 2005 at the request of the Korean Cultural Center of the Korean Embassy to promote Korean cooking to mainstream public. She was thankful for her special award. The president of KOWIN DC Chapter Myung Ho (Lucy) Nam gave congratulatory remarks.

### Eun Ae Lee, Chairwoman of the Korean American Foundation, Gave the Welcoming Speech for the 7<sup>th</sup> Anniversary of 'The Day of Koreans in America"



With the theme of "United as One Korean-American Community of the U.S., the New Challenges and Hope," the 7th anniversary of "The Day of Koreans in America" event was held on January 14, 2012 at the Culture Center of Northern Virginia Community College under the auspices of the Korean American Foundation, chaired by Ms. Eun Ae Lee.
